## Feedback Analysis on Curriculum for the Academic Year 2017-18

On the basis of the comprehensive analysis of the Stakeholder Feedback Report for the academic year 2017-18, the following steps have been initiated.

### Depth of the course content:

Out of 250 student respondents (92%), 230 were satisfied with the curriculum of the courses offered in the college. And the remaining 20 (8%) students were apprehensive. Majority of the teachers and alumni expressed satisfaction with reference to the curriculum of the courses. Hence it was resolved to continue with the curriculum.

## Applicability/ relevance to real life situations:

193 students out of (77%) 250 respondents felt that the curriculum was helpful in pursuing higher studies and finding employment. While 57 of them opined that it was not so helpful in finding employment. In the same way, majority of the teachers and alumni opined that the curriculum offered in the college was helpful in finding jobs for the students. The TSKC (Telangana Skills and Knowledge Centre) of the college is to be strengthened to benefit the students further with a special focus on employability skills and encourage students to enroll themselves in the MOOCs offered by the Spoken Tutorial, IIT Bombay, as part of the MoU with the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana

#### Learning values:

72 per cent (180 out of 250) of student respondents expressed that the curriculum was conducive to help them groom themselves to their satisfaction level. Majority of teachers, 21 out of 24 also expressed the same opinion. On the other hand, 28 per cent (70 out of 250) of students and 40% of alumni (6 out of 15) expressed their dissatisfaction. However the opinion of the stakeholders was taken into consideration and it was resolved to introduce capability enhancement and development schemes such as soft skills, computer skills, employability skills and coaching for competitive examinations.

#### Clarity and relevance:

168 out of 250 students (67%) and 18 out of 24 (75%) of the teachers felt that the curriculum offered in the college was relevant in addressing the needs of the society. 5 out of 15 (30%) of alumni opined that the curriculum did not address the needs of To satisfy the expectations of the stakeholders, it was resolved to send proposals to the affiliating university to strengthen the curriculum and revise the syllabus accordingly.

### Relevance of additional course material:

73% (183 out of 250) of the student respondents were of the opinion that the course content incorporated had the latest developments in it. Similarly, majority of teachers and alumni expressed the same. Very less number of the stakeholders felt that the curriculum needs to be updated with the latest developments. Hence, it was resolved to send proposals through the members of our faculty, who are on the Boof the affiliating university, i.e. Osmania University, to update the curriculum in order to meet the expectations and aspirations of the stakeholders.
